

Dr. Kwung-Ping Fu Memorial Scholarship

In the spring of 1996, together with the donation from many members of NATWA, closed friends and relatives, NATWA's 9th President Vivian Fu and her daughters Irene and Marilyn decided to set up a scholarship fund in memorial of their husband and father Dr. Kwung Ping Fu.

Dr. Fu was a native of Taiwan, born of Hakka parents. He earned his undergraduate degree from the Taiwan National University and his graduate degree from Kansas State University, Rutgers University and Columbia University. At the time of his death, he was Assistant Director of Microbiology at Johnson & Johnson Pharmaceutical Research Institute, Adjunct Assistant Professor of Pharmacology in Columbia University and also Professor at Seton Hall University. He published numerous papers and was well recognized within the infectious diseases research community.

The scholarship is to encourage second-generation young men & women within the Taiwanese American community to further their understanding and appreciation of their heritage by attending an internship, during their summer break, in any one non-profit Taiwanese American organizations.
